PLANTATION WARRANT

State of Maine

Franklin County, S. S.

To James Bachelder, a Constable in the Plantation of Coplin in said County of Franklin.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Plantation, qualified by law to vote in plantation affairs, to assemble at the Schoolhouse in said Plantation on the 1st. day of March, 1921, at one o'lock in the afternoon, to act on the following articles. to wit:

- Art. 1. To chooose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
 - Art. 2. To choose a Clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art. 3. To present and read plantation charges and outstanding bills.
- Art. 4. To choose all necessary Plantation officers for the ensuing year.
- Art. 5. To see if the plantation will grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary for the maintenance and support of schools and repairs of roads and bridges, and defray all other plantation charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for the support of schools for the ensuing year.

- Art. 7. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for free text-books for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for school supplies for the ensuing year.
- Art. 9 To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for the repair of roads and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 10. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise for repair of State Aid road for the ensuing year.
- Art. 11. To see if the plantation will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the plantation to State aid, as provided in Section 19 of Chapter 25 of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 12. To see if the plantation will vote to appropriate and raise the sum of \$300. for the improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission. in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges, the above amount being the maximum which the plantation is allowed to raise under the provisions of Section 18, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art. 13. To see how much money the plantation will vote to raise to pay outstanding bills.

The Assessors give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters at the schoolhouse at 12.30 in the afternoon, on the day of said meeting.

To the S. S. Committee and Citizens:

In accordance with law I submit the following report of the condition and progress and needs of the public school of Coplin Plantation.

CONDITION OF SCHOOL BUILDINGS

The desks in the school building were given a coat of stain and varnish, which improved their appearance considerably. Minor repairs have been made and a new stove purchased. The building is now in fairly good condition. Money should be appropriated at the next town meeting for a new flag, as the one in use now is in very poor condition.

PROGRESS OF SCHOOL

Good work has been made in the school. We were unfortunate in losing Miss Wilbur, but Miss Burrill is doing good work and the pupils are making good progress under her instruction.

Your superintendent recommends a change in the Arithmetic and English texts now in use and for this reason a larger appropriation than usual is asked for under the head of text books.

Parents are urged to visit the school frequently, talk over matters with the teachers, and thus be of assistance in solving our educational problems.

In conclusion I wish to thank the School Committee, teachers and citizens for their co-operation in carrying on the work of the schools.
